QUEER, FEMINIST, AND DECOLONIAL APPROACHES TO GENDER, SEXUALITY, AND ROMAN IMPERIALISM

The Institute of Classical Studies is organising a workshop on queer and transgender scholarship, black feminist and feminist new materialist perspectives, and decolonial and critical race theories in the studies of sexuality, identity, and imperialism in the Roman world and beyond.

The workshop convenes archaeologists, classicists, and ancient historians researching gender and sexuality in the Roman Empire. Paper presentations will be organised into three sessions: 'Queer, Post-colonial, and Associated Traditions in Roman Sexuality Research', 'Theory and Materiality', and 'Comparative Perspectives'.

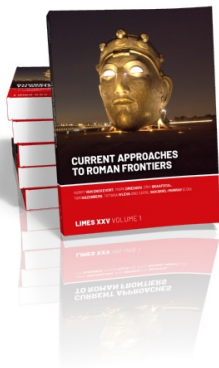
