Wiencke Postdoctoral Fellowship in Classics at Dartmouth College

The Department of Classics at Dartmouth College invites applications for the newly established Matthew Wiencke Postdoctoral Fellowship. Applicants for this position should be specialists in the languages, literature, philosophy, material culture, or history of the Greek or Roman world. The two-year residential fellowship will start on the **1st of July 2026**, with the fellows expected to teach one course per academic year and to pursue research activities while participating fully in the intellectual life of the Classics Department and Dartmouth College. Fellows receive an annual stipend of approximately \$67,580 plus benefits and an allocation for research expenses.
